Salvation Series - The Joy of being Forgiven: NOTES

**Psalm 90:14** - Satisfy us in the morning with your unfailing love, that we may sing for joy and be glad all our days.

**Hebrews 1:3** <sup>3</sup> The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven.

**Revelation 5:9** <sup>o</sup> And they sang a new song, saying:

"You are worthy to take the scroll and to open its seals, because you were slain, and with your blood you purchased for God persons from every tribe and language and people and nation.

**Titus 3:5** <sup>5</sup>he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit,

Colossians 1:14<sup>14</sup> in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

**Romans 5:9** 'Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him!

**James 1:8** says that someone who follows his feelings "is a doubleminded man, unstable in all he does."

Matthew 7:24-27, Jesus says, "Everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock. But everyone who hears these words of mine and does not put them into practice is like a foolish man who built his house on sand. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell with a great crash."

## That "rock" is God's Word.

Why do we exist? What are you here for? Isaiah 43:6-7 makes it clear that God created us for this purpose: to glorify Him.

**Isaiah 43:6-7**—it should be no surprise that Paul gives this command: whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God (1 Corinthians 10:31

Acts 20:24 - I consider my life worth nothing to me, if only I may finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me—the task of testifying to the gospel of God's grace.

Acts 20:24 about his desire to "run the race" with what he wrote decades later in 2 Timothy 4:7: I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith.

Leverage your Life? What is your life? **James 4:14**, You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes.

Matthew 6:19-20, Jesus instructs us not to amass (Accumulate/Stockpile) treasures on earth: Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal.

**Philippians 3:7-8** his passion for living life to do what lasts into eternity: But whatever was to my profit I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. What is more, I consider everything a loss compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them rubbish, that I may gain Christ. Paul willingly exchanged earthly profit, which doesn't last, for eternal gain.

Paul Wrote:1 Corinthians 2: 1-5 - And so it was with me, brothers and sisters. When I came to you, I did not come with eloquence or human wisdom as I proclaimed to you the testimony about God. 2 For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. 3 I came to you in weakness with great fear and trembling. 4 My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasive words, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, 5 so that your faith might not rest on human wisdom, but on God's power.

**Isaiah 43:7** - everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made."

**1 Corinthians 10:31** <sup>31</sup> So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God.
